Background

- This summer, the Municipality of South Huron received a grant from the Rural Ontario Institute (ROI) to hire a Youth Engagement Strategist to conduct a youth engagement strategy to:
 - 1) Identify gaps to make South Huron a more youth friendly community to attract and retain youth
 - 2) Build civic engagement among youth to ensure they feel their voice in being heard
 - 3) Highlight young people working in the municipal sector to get more youth interested in working in the municipal sector.
- Youth is defined as between the ages of 15 to 29
- South Huron is one of 10 communities across the province taking on this project.



About the Project

- We named it "Thrive South Huron" as we want to make South Huron a place where youth feel they can thrive here. Everything they need is right here in the municipality and they should not feel they need to go into "the city" to have their needs met.
- Social media was a key part of this project (we launched a municipal Instagram account)


- These meetings were to find out what gaps youth feel are in the community. Along

 - > Job opportunities (especially for beginners)
 - Activities geared towards older youth
 - Professional networking opportunities
 - Recreation
 - Activities (movie theatre, bowling alley, mall)
 - More restaurants
 - > Youth council



Survey


- Our Survey was available June 7th until July 14th at SouthHuron.ca

- 51 people took part in the survey






^{*}Those from outside of South Huron still had a current or previous connection to the community (i.e., former residents)






^{*}Those over the age of 30 had the same answers as those in our target age range






What makes you want to live in South Huron?





What's missing in South Huron and how would you fill the gap(s)?






What does

What about South Huron makes you want to invite friends or family to visit?





Recreational opportunities	80%	13%




What career opportunities do you see in South Huron?






What kind of job are you training for/interested in?
