These delays can have a long lasting effects resulting in preoccupation with the deceased causing the griever increased stress that can result in the manifestation of physical and emotional issues. The intensity of grief after a significant loss is something that is hard to imagine until you are experiencing it for yourself, including the task of burying your loved one. Please don't make this harder on people than it needs to be with unreasonable delays, I encourage counsel to please find a way around this issue and to continue burials through the winter months.
