Mayor's Task Force Community Recovery June 21, 2021

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Mandate

The Community Recovery Task Force will work with Community partners to develop a Recovery Strategy to support and empower the South Huron Community during and after the COVID-19 pandemic.

The Chair the Task Force will work closely with the Office of the CAO to liaise with members for the purpose of data collection and plan development.

The Task Force will develop and monitor the Work Plan approved by Council. Meetings will be held at the call of the Chair and meet minimally on a monthly basis. It is anticipated that the Task Force will continue throughout the Pandemic and post-Pandemic period as required.

Roles

Community Recovery Task Force - to assemble through virtual meetings on a regular basis (shifting to in person as permitted) to determine priorities with respect to information collection, provide insight, opinion, and feedback and to receive updates on strategy development and action items

Community Recovery Task Force

South Huron Staff – to project manage the development of the recover strategy, ensuring regular communication with the Task Force, and providing updates and recommendations to Council

External Support – to utilize resources and expertise to support and ensure a "made in South Huron" plan is carefully crafted by the Task Force, based on data through a South Huron and County lens.

Sector Support

The Community Recovery Task Force will need to reach out to community champions and decision-makers representing various organizations and agencies for sector specific supports in the community. Community champions, elected officials, regional government representatives and provincial government representatives will be a source of information, feedback or data for the Community.
