**Subject:** 2021 Ontario Trillium Foundation's Community

Building Fund - Capital Stream Application

#### **Recommendations:**

**That** Council receives the report from Scott Currie, Manager of Communications and Strategic Initiatives, titled "2021 Ontario Trillium Foundation's Community Building Fund - Capital Stream Application"; and,

**That** a funding application be submitted to the to the Ontario Trillium Foundation's Community Building Fund for capital work improvements at the Stephen Arena.

## **Purpose:**

Approval.

### **Background and Analysis:**

The Ontario Trillium Fund's Communty Building Fund - Capital Stream is a competitive, application-based grant that provides support for non-profits, Inidgenous communities and municipalities to repair, renovate or retrofit existing recreation facilities.

The application intake window is from September 1 – 29<sup>th</sup> and provides up to 100% of eligible costs for projects between \$10k and \$500k that support:

extending the life and maximize the use of existing facilities or

• implementing public health measures related to COVID-19 preparedness.

Staff are proposing to submit an application in support of capital work at the Stephen Arena to extend the life of this recreation asset.

The proposed scope of work in the application will be guided by the Municipality's long-term capital plan for the Stephen Arena (e.g., replacement of compressor, shell and tube chiller, surge drum, BAC evaporative condenser, arena floor, front door replacement), which is work that is necessary to continue operations at the Stephen Arena.

### **Operational Considerations:**

Staff will work to fine-tune the project scope for the application; however, at the time of writing this report, staff propose the municipality aim for a project scope that approaches the upper limit of the eligible costs (i.e., \$500k) and demonstrates contributed funds for cost-sharing this project.

# **Financial Impact:**

It is not likely hear the outcome until next year - well after 2022 budget deliberations have concluded. Staff recommend that Council budget for the 2022 capital plan as normal and if the municipality is successful in receiving this grant Council can choose to place the budgeted amount into the recreation reserve for future use.

The proposed scope of work is as follows:
