Subject: Traffic Calming Policy

Recommendations:

Purpose:

Background and Analysis:

The public and Council have frequently raised concerns regarding speeding and aggressive driving on residential streets in the Municipality, especially in high risk areas, such as near schools, parks and hospitals. Enforcement can only go so far in dealing with these issues. An effective tool that can be

utilized to address these traffic related issues is to use traffic calming measures.

Staff are presenting a Traffic Calming Policy, which uses universally accepted traffic calming measures to help address this issue. The proposed policy will provide staff with a guidance document and procedure for the initiation, investigation and implementation of traffic calming measures within the Municipality. The proposed policy also ensures that there is a formal process for traffic calming requests that utilizes consistent criteria.
