

The Corporation of the Municipality of South Huron

By-Law #13-2022

Being a By-Law to authorize an Agreement with Her Majesty the Queen in right of Ontario as represented by the Minister of Municipal Affairs and Housing (MMAH) for funding under the Ontario Transfer Payment Agreement (Modernization Fund).

Whereas the *Municipal Act, 2001, as amended*, provides under Section 5(1) that the powers of a Municipality shall be exercised by its Council and under Section 5(3) provides that a municipal power shall be exercised by By-Law; and

Whereas the *Municipal Act, 2001, as amended* provides under Section 9 that the municipality has the capacity, rights, powers and privileges of a natural person for the purpose of exercising its authority under the Act; and

Whereas the Municipality of South Huron deems it desirable to enter into this Agreement with Her Majesty The Queen In Right Of Ontario, as represented by the Minister of Municipal Affairs and Housing (MMAH) for funding under the Ontario Transfer Payment Agreement to the Corporation of the Municipality of South Huron in the amount of \$30,528.00.

Now therefore be it resolved that the Council of The Corporation of the Municipality of South Huron enacts as follows:

1. That the Chief Administrative Officer is hereby authorized to execute the Agreement with Her Majesty The Queen In Right Of Ontario, as represented by the Minister of Municipal Affairs and Housing (MMAH) for funding under the Ontario Transfer Payment Agreement to the Corporation of the Municipality of South Huron, identified as Schedule 'A' and attached hereto.
2. That Schedule 'A' shall form an integral part of this By-Law.
3. That authority to make administrative changes to this by-law that do not change the intent are delegated to the Chief Administrative Officer or their Designate.
4. That this By-Law takes effect upon the date of final passing.

Read a first and second time this 22nd day of February, 2022.

Read a third time and finally passed this 22nd day of February, 2022.
