Summary of Committee Outcomes and Approval to Dissolve Committee

Background and Information:

At the Regular Council meeting on October 7, 2019 South Huron council approved the six (6) members of the CCAAC.

As outlined in the Climate Change Adaptation Advisory Committee Terms of Reference (ToR), the purpose of the Climate Change Adaptation Advisory Committee (hereafter referred to as 'the Committee') is to:

- Advise Council, Administration and Consultant/Project Management Team on specific matters as they pertain to the Municipality's Climate Change Adaptation Plan.
- The Committee will share opinions and perspectives and offer collective advice to staff and Consultants/Project Management Team.

The Committee was created based on the approved workplan for the Climate Change Adaptation Strategy project. Public consultation plays an important part in the corporate decision-making process by providing a means for staff and Council to receive the views and advice from citizen members on a variety of matters.

The Committee's input has enabled a planning process that is open, transparent and meaningful to the community.

The Committee met regularly from December 2019 until July 2021 with the following notable achievements to satisfy the Committee ToR:

- Provided significant input into shaping <u>South Huron's Climate Change</u> <u>Adaptation Strategy</u>.
- Planned, developed and published a seven (7) episode, <u>climate change video</u> <u>series</u> focused on various topics and expert opinions, as determined by the Committee.

Committee's Role in Strengthening South Huron's Climate Adaptation Efforts

Throughout the duration of the Committee's meetings, the following action items were strongly supported by the Committee members and identified as being important items to be addressed immediately:

- 1. Include climate change consideration section in staff reports to Council
- 2. Develop a qualitative climate lens tool to guide staff and Council decision-making

3. Develop a process to ensure climate change adaptation is considered during review of existing and development of new policies and plans for South Huron

4. Develop a naturalization strategy focused on riparian areas located on municipal properties. (In particular, MacNaughton Park was discussed)

Municipal staff have been working to plan and implement the action items, as outlined in the adaptation Strategy. Related to the above, it should be noted that:

- Action items 1-3 listed above are being considered during the Procedural Bylaw review.
- Action item 4 listed above has been initiated through Council's approval of a grant submission to the Intact Foundation for the re-naturalization pilot. The grant application has been formally submitted for this project.

It is important to recognize the dedication and efforts from all members of the Committee and work in positioning South Huron as a regional leader in adapting to climate change. The achievements as identified will be used to guide the actions of the municipality for the next several years and will produce lasting impacts.
