iii) Becky Dewitt from the Kirkton Fair board made a presentation about upgrades to the parking area near the Outdoor Pavilion. They would like to undertake some grading of the old track area to allow vehicles to park and get off of Hwy 23, increasing safety. They would use the cattle/sheep trailers, along the east side of property to provide a visual barrier. This would be at no expense to the board.
