It certainly was quite an significant weather event in our community. I have attached the regulations regarding minimum standards so we are all on the same page.

Many municipalities have bylaws to clarify, and address this regulation, so that it is clear to the operations staff when to call the event, and routes and equipment deployment for municipal roads. Would you consider a policy to assist operations.

My concern is, even though a significant weather event has been called, there has been no consideration for snow build up at corners particularly from subdivision streets on to the more travelled streets.

I would ask you to look into intersections on Huron Street and Snider, Carling, Mary where a vehicle or person has to be 4 feet into Huron St before they can see well enough to proceed unto the road. Buses are now operating, and our roads are clearing allowing faster travel, but the corners remain visually obstructed.
